They are not playing a game.

Вопросительная форма

- Вопросительные предложения образуются при помощи нужной формы глагола **to be** (*am, is, are*) + **подлежащее** + **смысловой глагол** с окончанием **-ing**.
Are they playing a game?

Краткие ответы

- В кратких ответах употребляется **Yes** или **No**, личное местоимение в именительном падеже (*I, you, he* и др.) и глагол **to be** в нужной форме. Смысловой глагол с окончанием **-ing** в ответе опускается.
